A monthly wrap of the club's achievements and activities by Ross Fisher - Life Governor and Club President

With two recent drownings on the Sunshine Coast and another on the Gold Coast, it reminds us why we are Lifesavers and commit to providing the very best patrolling possible. To achieve high standards in our Patrols, members are required to consider becoming a Patrol Captain or Deputy Captain to ensure high standards are maintained. Club Captain Roger Aspinall has run numerous sessions and courses to assist members considering this and



recently completed a course on leadership run by a specialist training group from Brisbane. So, if you feel that you could step up to either of these rolls then please contact Roger to discuss further and how the Club will assist you.

A Bronze Course successfully was completed last weekend with six new Bronze members graduating. The seventh just must complete one section as was not able to complete it due to an injury. This successful course was completed by Lyndon Forlonge and Jim Henderson under CTO Paul Jenkinson. Congratulations to all.

The training centre is completed with new tables and training equipment ordered. This TV and includes Media requirements plus kitchen appliances. Many chairs [120] have been in storage from the last Supporters Club Renovation and furniture replacement. Supporters Club Board held their Monthly Board Meeting there last week where they were very impressed with the facility, and what it will offer the members into the future. This cooperation



provides confidence to the Supporters Board who are responsible for delivering the majority of funding to the Surf Club. It is also anticipated that Yoga and/or Pilates will commence during March and Administration are currently seeking qualified instructors.

A very successful Skin Cancer Check Program was held over some 9 days out in front of the Club. A Sponsorship Contract for 3 years was created between the Club and PIM Group [Skin Check Champions] who manage the logistics and delivery of this service for La Rochelle Posay. The statistics from the skin tests were eye opening and as follows

- 969 skin checks
- 1,149 images
- 548 suspect lesions
- 114 potential skin cancers Potentially including...
- 110 Basal Cell Carcinoma
- 13 Squamous Cell Carcinoma

We intend to accommodate them again next year as a fantastic initiative for our community.







The Building Working Group met again in early February and have now created a list of some 15 Architects to be invited to tour the Club and attend a briefing of the project. From there the Working Group will be able to establish their interest in the project and ability to deliver to the Club's requirements. In the meantime, the Dilapidation Investigation has continued, with numerous consultants having attended the Club for site inspections and briefings with Project Manager Adam Britton and myself. Structural Engineers, Building Inspectors, Electrical Engineers, and Mechanical Engineers. Their reports will be due by our March Meeting. I have also met with Noosa Councils Waste Manager to discuss the many issues surrounding our Waste Management. This is becoming an increasing problem in Hastings Street, so they are looking for many solutions including compaction and other possible solutions.

I attended the interviews for the Nipper Captains for 2024/25 where the applicants for Captains and Deputy Captains were selected ready for being announced at the JAC Awards on Sunday March 10th. This year they will be held on the Beach in a Marquee, set up for the Festival of Surfing, after the Nipper Program that will commence at an earlier start time of 7am. Thank you to all the applicants for putting their names forward for consideration It is appreciated.

Under the Strategic Plan the Club is continuing to expand and compliment departments where required. The new Surf Sports Manager has been engaged and will commence duties on Monday 8th April. Craig Law, who is known by many Club members, has been appointed to fill this very important position to assist Surf Sports with direction, development and guiding us with confidence into the future. Craig has served 25 years with Queensland Police and was recently the Sunshine Coasts Dog Squad 's Sergeant-Officer in Charge. Craig's roles include progressing the development of our Club's Life Savers and Surf Sports members by introducing and managing programs, motivating, and inspiring members to strive and achieve strong and successful long-term results from U6's through to Masters. Craig is highly respected in all areas of life saving due to his many qualities including being honestly direct, Club's future direction, planning and instruction ability, active listening, leadership, strategic development, and his ability to communicate at all levels. Craig has been involved with the Life Saving Association for 20 years, was JAC Director at Sunshine Beach from 2007 to 2011, became President in 2012 -2020 and received Life Membership in the same year. He was awarded Life Membership of Branch in 2021 after many years of service, including some 13 years as Team Manager for the Branch Interbranch Team. He is currently Team manager for both the Australian and Queensland Youth Life Saving Teams and in 2019 received the Volunteer of the Year Awards from SS Coast Branch, SLSQ and SLSA.

Kim Leaman has been employed as a pert time Receptionist and Sam Cashmore employed as a full time Surf Education Coordinator to work with Sacha. Both of these new members of our staff, will add knowledge and experience to our Team and I ask you to join the Board in welcoming them to the Club.
